ORDER

Petitioner.

On February 8, 1995, a hearing took place in the above-referenced matter. Assistant Attorney General Peter H. Schelstraete appeared on behalf of the Arizona Department of Insurance ("Department"). Petitioner Richard A. Stevens ("Mr. Stevens") appeared in propria persona.

Based upon the entire record in this matter, including all pleadings, motions, testimony, and exhibits admitted during the hearing of this matter, Administrative Law Judge Gregory Y. Harris has prepared the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order for consideration and approval by the Director of the Arizona Department of Insurance (the "Director"). The Director adopts and enters the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and enters the following Order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On October 12, 1994, Mr. Stevens filed an application for an individual property and casualty agent insurance license with the Department.
- 2. Question 1 in Section F of the Application for Individual Insurance License (the "Application") asks, "Have you ever been convicted of a misdemeanor?" Mr. Stevens responded "yes" to Question 1 in Section F.

- 3. Question 2 in Section F of the Application asks, "Have you EVER been convicted of a felony?" Mr. Stevens responded "yes" to Question 2 in Section F.
- 4. Question 3 in Section F of the Application asks, "Have you EVER been arrested, questioned, served a criminal summons, taken into custody, charged with, tried for, or ever been the subject of an investigation concerning the violation of any felony or misdemeanor, or are any charges now pending against you?" Mr. Stevens responded "yes" to Question 3 in Section F.
- 5. On November 4, 1994, the Department notified Mr. Stevens by mail that his application for an insurance license was denied. Mr. Stevens filed a timely written request for a hearing with the Department.
- 6. In 1974, Mr. Stevens was arrested for burglary.
 On June 10, 1974, the District Court of Sherman County, for the Judicial District of Texas, found Mr. Stevens guilty of the above charge.
- 7. In 1975, Mr. Stevens was arrested and convicted of criminal trespass in Potter County, Texas.
- 8. On December 12, 1986, Mr. Stevens was charged with causing, under circumstances other than those likely to produce death or serious physical injury, recklessly caused Michele Reed, a child, to suffer physical injury or abuse, in violation of A.R.S. §§13-3623(A)(B), 13-701, 13-702, 13-801 and 13-812. On February 17, 1987, a waiver of Preliminary Hearing with Plea Agreement was entered by the Maricopa County Superior Court case number CR87-01135. Mr. Stevens pled guilty to child abuse, a class 6 felony, and the Court placed Mr. Stevens on 3 years

probation with counseling. On October 27, 1988, the court released Mr. Stevens from probation and redesignated his child abuse conviction as a misdemeanor.

- 9. On May 2, 1991, Mr. Stevens was charged with knowingly disobeying or resisting the lawful order, process or mandate of the Court, a class 1 misdemeanor, in violation of A.R.S. §13-2810(A)(2). These charges stemmed from Mr. Stevens' violation of an order of protection entered against him in connection with a domestic relations proceeding. On February 18, 1992, City of Phoenix Municipal Court found Mr. Stevens guilty of the above charge and placed him on 2 years probation for Complaint charges 8618480 and 8618759.
- trespass occurred nearly 20 years ago. Since that time, rather than demonstrating his rehabilitation or his ability or willingness to refrain from further violations of the law, Mr. Stevens has committed other crimes. These continuing occurrences of violations of the law bear directly upon the Director's assessment of whether Mr. Stevens has met the burden imposed by law to demonstrate the he qualifies to hold an insurance license. Mr. Stevens' conviction of burglary in 1974, an offense of moral turpitude, when considered along with the his subsequent convictions, do not resolve the serious questions about Mr. Stevens' honesty, integrity or personal values first raised by the burglary conviction.
- 11. Mr. Stevens has failed to meet his burden to demonstrate his qualification for the issuance of a license.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Mr. Stevens received notice of this proceeding as prescribed by A.R.S. §§20-163 and 41-1061.
- 2. The Director has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to A.R.S. $\S 20-142$.
- 3. Mr. Stevens has a record of conviction by final judgment of a felony involving moral turpitude pursuant to A.R.S. §20-290(B)(6).

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED:

The application submitted by Petitioner Richard A. Stevens for the issuance of an individual property and casualty insurance agent license shall not be approved, and the requested license shall not be issued.

NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS

The aggrieved party may request a rehearing with respect to this Order by filing a written petition with the Administrative Law Division within 30 days of the date of this Order, setting forth the basis for such relief pursuant to A.A.C. R4-14-114(B).

The final decision of the Director may be appealed to the Superior Court of Maricopa County for judicial review pursuant to A.R.S. $\S 20-166$.
